3. I support ensuring that those who have successfully served their time have their full voting rights restored and support ensuring those who already have their voting rights, like those with misdemeanors, do not have their voting rights violated.

5. Lowering the voting age to 16 or 17 for citizens would require a constitutional amendment and this merits further study and debate. I do not support extending suffrage to those who are not American citizens.

6. I support the Capital Gains tax enacted by the Legislature and under threat by I-2109 (I oppose I-2109).

7. Universal Basic Income (UBI) merits further discussion, especially how a UBI program could be implemented and sustained in WA State.

9. I support discussing making community and technical college more affordable within the context of framing the 2025-2026 biennial budget. Expanding the WA College grant and and/or providing additional state assistance must be fiscally sustainable.

10. The Legislature must provide close oversight about the implementation of I-2081 and I fully support amendments to I-2081 or new legislation that ensures that our LGBTQ+ students are protected and safe in our schools.

14. I support an "all the above" approach to this issue. We must ensure that our law enforcement have the tools and training needed to maintain public safety while also realizing that many of the challenges we face in our local communities such as housing insecurity, drug addition, etc. is a mental health issue and the state should provide adequate funding into mental health services.

18. I oppose I-2117, I-2109, and I-2124. I-2066 is a newer initiative and I need further study of this issue before taking a stance for the November election.

19. I support this within a structure process that ensures collaboration between residents and city staff.
